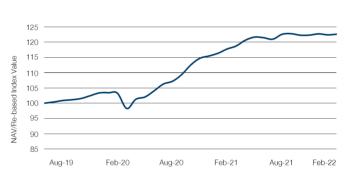

Commentary

February proved to be a difficult month for both equity and bond markets as concerns surrounding the Russian invasion of Ukraine grew. During the first half of the month, the expected number of central bank interest rate hikes ramped up quickly. There were growing concerns that the central banks may have to sacrifice growth to get inflation under control. During the second half of the month, investors' attention turned to the conflict in Ukraine, which dampened expectations for rate hikes compared with the intramonth peak, while also impacting growth expectations.

M&A activity continued on its robust trajectory during February, North America has continued to drive activity, with a string of high profile deals announced during the month. Key industries which drew the largest number of deals during February included financials, consumer cyclical and communications. This comes as firms look to make strategic changes and allocate capital to invest in innovation or companies with a disruptive business model.

Lockheed Martin announced that it had ended its bid to buy Aerojet Rocketdyne after the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) sued to block the USD 4.4 billion due to the lack of competition among defence contractors. This was the second major challenge brought by FTC Chair Lina Khan in as many months, this comes after the FTC expanded the scope of merger review information requests. Allowing the FTC to place greater scrutiny on deals that are anti-competitive in nature, while also being able to restrict future acquisitions for companies that pursue these types of deals.

Despite growing concerns surrounding the regulatory landscape, global M&A is expected to grow with private equity, CEO confidence, SPACs and the availability of financing all acting as key drivers in the coming months.

The new deals announced in February arose from a variety of different industries, including but not limited to technology, financials and retail, a selection of which are outlined below:

- Hinode KK/Aichi announced the acquisition of AT-Group for JPY 138.9 billion
- Salmar ASA stated its intention to acquire NTS ASA for NOK 26.5 billion
- The Toronto-Dominion Bank announced the USD 13.3 billion acquisition of First Horizon Corp
- A Consortium proposed a deal to acquire Zendesk for USD 15.7 billion
- Healthcare Realty Trust announced a deal to buy of Healthcare Trust of America for USD 10 billion
- Standard General announced the acquisition USD 8.7 billion of TEGNA
- A consortium led by Brookfield proposed a deal to acquire AGL Energy for AUD 7.9 billion
- Frontier Group Holdings announced the USD 6.3 billion acquisition of Spirit Airlines
- JP Morgan IM announced the acquisition of South Jersey Industries for USD 7.4 billion
- Apollo stated its intention to acquire Tenneco for USD 6.1 billion
- Sartorius AG proposed to a deal to buy Maravai LifeSciences for USD 5.5 billion
- Monarch Alternative Capital LP proposed a deal to buy Paramount for USD 5.9 billion
- Vivendi SE announced the acquisition of Lagardere SA for EUR 5.5 billion
- Intel Corp announced the USD 5.4 billion acquisition of Tower Semiconductor

Fund performance

From a deal perspective, the following were the primary contributors to portfolio performance during February:

TEGNA 0.10% - In February 2022, TEGNA and Standard General entered into a definitive agreement under which TEGNA will be acquired for USD 24.00 per share in cash, a premium of approximately 39%. The transaction has an equity value of approximately USD 5.4 billion and an enterprise value of approximately USD8.6 billion, including debt.

Cerner 0.07% - During December 2021, Oracle announced a USD 28.3 billion all-cash deal to buy Cerner for USD 95.00 per share. During February the share price spiked after Cerner received the antitrust approval in the US. The deal is now expected to close during 1H 2022, subject to certain regulatory approvals and satisfying other closing conditions, including Cerner stockholders tendering a majority of Cerner shares.

The primary detractors to performance from a deal perspective were:

Spok Holdings -0.08% - During August 2021 - Spok Holdings announced that it had received a letter, from Acacia Research Corporation regarding a proposal to acquire all of the outstanding shares of common stock of Spok for USD 10.75 per share in cash. Spok's Board of Directors stated that they intended to evaluate the letter in consultation with its regular independent financial and legal advisors. In February 2022, Spok announced a new strategic business plan focused on cash flow generation which was met with initial disappointment by investors.

Chiasma -0.28% - In May 2021, Amryt a rare diseases company, announced that it has signed a definitive agreement to acquire Chiasma a US-listed firm in an all-stock deal. The USD 340 million deal was successfully closed in August 2021, following the receipt of the necessary approvals of both Amryt's and Chiasma's shareholders. On 28th February 2022, the company received a negative Complete Response Letter from the FDA for Oleogel-S10 NDA.

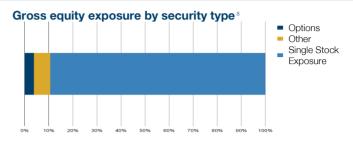

Risk Glossary

Market Risk: The Fund is subject to normal market fluctuations and the risks associated with investing in international securities markets and therefore the value of your investment and the income from it may rise as well as fall and you may not get back the amount originally invested.

Counterparty Risk: The Fund will be exposed to credit risk on counterparties with which it trades in relation to on-exchange traded instruments such as futures and options and where applicable, 'over-the-counter' ("OTC","non-exchange") transactions. OTC instruments may also be less liquid and are not afforded the same protections that may apply to participants trading instruments on an organised exchange.

Currency Risk: The value of investments designated in another currency may rise and fall due to exchange rate fluctuations.
