What is this product?

Type

Share of a sub-fund part of an umbrella fund in corporate form.

Term

This product does not have a maturity date, the competent body of the PRIIP (as identified in the offering documentation) is entitled to terminate the product. The amount you would receive in the event of such termination might be lower than the amount you invested.

Objectives

Investment objective The Sub-fund aims to achieve long-term capital appreciation, through an active and diversified unconstrained asset allocation relying on the potential returns of different classes allocation. The portfolio will be exposed to core asset classes (such as listed equity and bonds), and to satellite asset classes (through either (i) derivatives with indirect exposure such as, but not limited to, commodities, alternative strategies, and (ii) limited exposure to unlisted securities) with the aim to benefit from diversification and/or to hedge against inflation.

Investment policy Core asset classes

The Sub-fund seeks to achieve its objective by investing, directly or indirectly, at least 70% of its net assets in a flexible allocation to different assets classes including, but not limited to, equity, government bonds and corporate bonds, Money Market Instruments, globally as well as deposits.

There is no pre-determined overall exposure of the Sub-fund to those asset classes. The Investment Manager determines and may vary the asset classes allocation based on analysis of macroeconomic and market conditions and expectations with close consideration to risks and the potential for returns.

In line with the above, the Sub-fund's investments may include, but are not limited to, equities and equity-linked securities, REITs, Investment Grade and/or Non-Investment Grade bonds and debt-related securities of any kind such as eligible debentures, notes and convertibles, UCITS, UCIs, ETFs, derivative instruments such as, but not limited to, index or single name futures, dividend futures, TRS, CDS and equity and index options. Issuers of the aforementioned securities may be located in any OECD or non-OECD country, including emerging markets, without any pre-determined limitation in terms of geographics area, capitalization size sector, or currency as the case may be.

For the purposes of this Sub-fund, REITs shall mean equity securities of closed ended real estate investment trusts.

The Sub-fund may be directly or indirectly exposed up to 40% of its net assets to equity securities.

The Sub-fund exposure to securities with Non-Investment Grade credit rating or that are in the opinion of the Investment Manager of comparable quality may not exceed 50% of its net assets. The Sub-fund may also be exposed to Distressed Debt Securities (being securities having a rating CCC+ or below from S&P or any equivalent grade of other credit rating agencies) as a result of the potential downgrading of the issuers. In such case, the position the Sub-fund directly holds in any Distressed Debt Securities will be sold as soon as possible, under normal market

circumstances, and in the best interest of shareholders and, in any event, the proportion of the Distressed Debt Securities shall not amount to more than 5% of the Sub-fund's net assets. If no rating is available, then an equivalent credit rating, as deemed by the Investment Manager, may be used.

Investment in CoCos is allowed up to 20% of the Sub-fund's net assets.

Up to 100% of the Sub-fund's net assets may be invested in units or shares of UCITS, UCIs and UCITS-ETFs. Such other UCITS, UCIs or UCITS-ETFs must be compliant with the provisions set out in Article 41 (1) e) of the UCI Law.

It is pointed out that a part, up to 80%, of such UCITS, UCIs or UCITS-ETFs might be selected from funds managed or advised by group Generali or affiliated parties (Generali group funds).

All investments in UCITS, UCIs and/or UCITS-ETFs, including those in Generali Group funds, will be done in the lowest share class available in terms of fees considering the eligible investors definition.

Satellite asset classes

For investment, diversification purposes and/or to hedge against inflation, the Sub-fund may invest (i) up to 20% of its net assets in derivatives based on eligible financial indices on commodities and/or other eligible UCITS, UCIs and/or ETC providing exposure to commodities and/or other eligible UCITS, UCIs and ETFs having an alternative strategy and (ii) up to 10% of its net assets in equity securities not listed on stock exchanges.

Benchmark The Fund has no reference benchmark.

Redemption policy The Fund is open-ended. You may redeem shares of the Fund on any Luxembourg business day.

Distribution policy The Share Class makes no dividend payment. Earned income is retained and reinvested.

Derivatives policy The Fund may use financial instruments and derivatives for hedging purposes, for efficient portfolio management purposes and for investment purposes.

Intended retail investor

The Fund expects that a typical investor in the Sub-fund will be a medium term investor who knows and accepts the risks associated with this type of investment. It is designed to form part of a portfolio of investments.

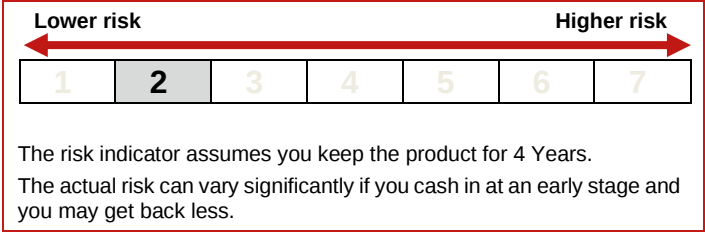

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risks



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will

Performance scenarios

What happens if Generali Investments Luxembourg S.A. is unable to pay out?

What are the costs?

- in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario,
- EUR 10 000 is invested.
